RAISING AWARENESS OF THE NETWORK WITH OPPORTUNITY QUILT

For the first time, the Network is using a quilt to tell it's story. "Chocolat Bits" is a beautiful, pieced quilt in blue, brown and red, designed by Lissa Alexander of Moda Fabrics, with the pattern in the December 2006 issue of McCall's Quilting. Candy Hargrove of Kansas City, MO, pieced the quilt, and Kathleen Coleman of Liberty, MO, machine quilted it.

The Network wants to accomplish two things:

1. Show the quilt at as many guild meetings, events and quilt shows as possible, spreading the word about the benefits of belonging to HQN. We all know that when we see a quilt, we pay attention!
2. Use the money raised from the sale of tickets to print a brochure about HQN. The brochures would be sent to guilds that are non-members of the Network, as well as distributed to area quilt professionals.

The success of HQN depends on all it's members working together. Our guilds will be stronger if we provide them with information about talented speakers and teachers, and ways to provide quality programs by sharing expenses. Our regional teachers will benefit from the exposure we can give them about their programs and workshops, as well as ideas for working with the guilds.

Tickets are \$1 each, or 6 for \$5. The lucky winner will be chosen at the next Spring Meeting in 2010.

QUILTER'S GUILD OF GREATER KC

The Quilters Guild of Greater Kansas City is one of the oldest quilt guilds in the Midwest. In 1975, Terry Thompson, who owned a quilt shop in Kansas City at that time, came up with the idea of organizing a quilt guild. As the title indicates, the guild is composed of members from all over the metropolitan area of Kansas City and surrounding areas. Over the years, the guild has changed in many ways. At first, its emphasis was on educating the public about quilting. Now that quilting is so popular, the guild focuses on other areas. Even in the early days of the guild, it was a large guild. Because our membership runs around 200-plus members, the guild is able to bring in well-known speakers and to sponsor bus trips to quilt shows and interesting places. Every February, we have a three-day retreat in Parkville, Missouri. Our members actively support making quilts for many different charities from Linus to local hospitals to Doctors with A Heart in Russia. The guild has met in several churches and is presently at First Lutheran Church at the corner of State Line and

64th Street in Mission Hills, Kansas. Guild members have lectured and taught for other guilds, and a number of them work and teach in area quilt shops. The guild has several "guild quilts" commemorating different things. The one for Missouri hung in Senator John Danforth's Washington, D. C. office, and the one for Kansas hung in the Governor's office and the Capitol Rotunda. The first quilt show was in 1977 at Swope Park. In 1980, it moved to Crown Center where it has been a fixture bringing in thousands of visitors over the years. This is probably how most people know of the guild. One of the efforts of the show was to support the Mayor's Christmas Tree Fund by selling miniature quilts. This guild is one of the first guilds to do that at a quilt show. Early on the quilts were auctioned off, bringing in thousands of dollars for the Christmas Fund. A book of miniatures made by guild members and edited by Rosie Grinstead, sold for many years. Sadly, Crown Center notified us this year that they can no longer sponsor the quilt show; so this will be the first year since 1977 that the guild will not have a quilt show. We will be celebrating our 35th Anniversary this year with a number of special events.

This year we are having a 35th Anniversary celebration bringing in twin sisters, Roberta Horton and Mary Mashuta, for workshops and a day of lectures. We will have space for 300 people to attend the meeting on Saturday, May 1, 2010. Both Roberta and Mary will conduct three different workshops on April 29th and 30th. If you are interested in attending the lectures or workshops go to the website of Quilters Guild of Greater Kansas City, www.quiltguildofgkc.org. The events are described and there is a registration form to fill out. The cost to attend the day-long lectures is \$10.00 if you are not a member of the guild. We recommend that you also plan to eat lunch at the event. Note the deadline for registering is April 13, 2010. Quilter's Guild of Greater Kansas City meets every second Tuesday of the month at 10:00 a.m. at First Lutheran

Church on 64th and Stateline in Mission Hills,
Kansas.
