Minutes of Heartland Quilt Network Board of
Directors meeting
April 13, 2012

Members attending: Hazel Meade, Vicki Jackson, Carol Kuse, Sharon Crozier, Donna diNatale, Dawn Hesse, Ann Dougherty, Reeze Hansen, Sue Chaffee, Nancy Wakefield.

Treasurer's Report: As of April 8, 2012 we have \$3889.38 in the bank. This does not reflect any of the money that will come in to the annual meeting tomorrow for lunches and memberships. Board members were reminded that they have to pay dues in order to be current on membership, per by-laws.

Membership Report: Currently have 103 members.

Website: Take professionals names out of the member's only section and place on the website so the public can see their information. Need more links for the registration form; have the information in more than one place on the website. Do we have a back-up system for website?

Publicity Chair: Hazel asked for someone to do it. No one volunteered. She will ask again at annual meeting. This person would contact guilds and professionals and be an advocate for HQN.

The Board decided upon the **dates for the next annual meeting** for April 13th, 2013, with a second choice of April 20th. The April 20th date is the same time as Paducah. We would like to stay with the church for now.

IMQA has their quilt show on from May 16 - 19. This is the last year for it in Kansas City. We have been offered a booth for free on Friday, May 18 and Saturday, May 19. Nancy Wakefield will be in charge of the booth; we will only work on Friday, not Saturday. Candy Hargrove and Rosalyn Douglass will help her.

Election of Officers: There was some confusion about terms of office. We have been electing them to serve two years, but a study of the by-laws indicates that officers need to be elected

each year. It was suggested that we may need to review the by-laws.

Sharon Crozier, membership chairman, has served her full term. The job description says that she keeps the network roster; gives information to Webmaven; sends membership checks to treasurer; it helps to have a scanner for the checks. **Nancy Root was elected to serve as membership chair.** Some discussion was held about using a Pay Pal to pay for membership. Nothing was decided.

The **newsletter editor, Lydia Lowe**, was requesting information, as the newsletter will go out soon.

We need a current Board of Directors roster.

We held discussion about the **annual meeting** on Saturday. 73 people had signed up to come. We had 17 professionals and 11 opportunity quilts. (The actual count was 20 professionals and 15 opportunity quilts.) Twenty-five guilds were represented. We will try to keep people out of the gym while the professionals and opportunity quilts set up. We discussed where people would help, such as with the drinks, with the lunch, working to help set up the gym, etc. We need to come up with some way to control people who register late. Right now the church is fine, but we are reaching capacity. Having people call the day before the meeting is really putting a strain on things.

Inscribed Quilts", will run through December 2, 2012. Inscribed quilts emerged in the USA in the 1840's. They often were gifts for friends and neighbors, marking important events such as marriage and childbirth. (Quoted from USA Today).
